Individualism: Our Greatest Threat

Individualism is on the rise in our society and notably so in the church. It is perhaps one of the greatest threats to our Conference. This thinking that all actions take place for the benefit of the individual and not for society, as a whole, is demonstrated in our local churches' response to Conference's call for connexionalism. The pursuit of the individual churches rather than our common or collective interests can result in a less effective Conference.

Member Churches and Entities of the Bahamas Conference of the Methodist Church will have at least three opportunities to show their spirit of connexionalism. The first is to remember all churches and entities throughout our Conference area and to be in prayer, particularly for those churches and entities that are struggling. Second, and more specific, local churches and entities should support the BCMC initiative called 'Get Out Of Debt'. Third, we call upon all Churches in the Nassau Region to follow the examples of the Eastern Abaco and the North, Central and South Eleuthera Regions. These Regions have an Annual Mission Service that raises funds to assist with the outreach work of the church.

Executive Highlights The Andros Mission

The BCMC Churches in Andros have become the centre of the Executive investment of time and resources. Because of the decline in church membership and the deterioration of the property and the BCMC vision of new growth and vitality in Stafford Creek and Staniard Creek, the Executive Committee has taken several steps to bring about the desired change. Amongst those changes are 1) The re-establishment of an Andros Mission Support Group whose objective is the empowerment of local Androsian leadership, and 2) The appointment of a full time local pastor there, effective March 2012.

All Nassau Region Churches are asked to pray for and financially support the Andros Mission.

Nassau Region Challenged to Missions

BCMC Member Churches of the Nassau Region are being challenged by the Executive Committee to share in what is hoped to become an Annual Mission Service. This initiative was inspired by the obvious needs of sister churches in the Family Islands. While many, in the Churches of the Nassau Region, enjoy the lavish comforts of their worship environment, many of our churches in the Family Islands are going with their basic needs unmet. The Mission appeal will make us aware of those needs and how our sacrificial giving will help those churches.

The appeal however will be made to churches rather than to individual members. Each church will be targeted a certain amount.

The date for the Mission Service and Ingathering of mission funds is Sunday, March 11, 2012 at 6:00 p.m. This will be a Nassau Regional Service at Grants Town Wesley Methodist Church. We hope to see all members of the Nassau Region in attendance.
